Mayor Art Bishop and Council Member Scott Nassif attended the ribbon cutting ceremony welcoming the iconic Trigger statue back to Apple Valley on Friday, March 9th. The 24-foot-tall statue of Roy Roger's horse is now prominently displayed at the Spirit River Center on Apple Valley Road, north of Highway 18. Many longtime residents of Apple Valley recall when the golden Palomino was located at the Roy Roger's and Dale Evans Museum in Apple

No Trespassing An Update from your Apple Valley Police Department



The Apple Valley Police Department has been informed of an increase in the homeless activity in the PBID area. This activity is disrupting to the local businesses. We have teamed up with Apple Valley Code Enforcement to put together a Trespass Arrest Authorization form. By filling out the form you are giving authorization for the deputy to cite or arrest an individual who is trespassing on your property. You as the business owner do not have to be on the premises and your business does not have to be open for this to happen.

The trespass authorization form will allow the police department and code enforcement to handle everything on your behalf. The business owner will not have to appear in court. All court appearances regarding the trespassing incident will be handled by code enforcement.

The volunteers with the police department have been going door to door in the area trying to contact as many businesses as possible to have them fill out a trespass form. If your business has not yet been contacted, a representative from the police department attends the monthly PBID meeting and has the forms readily available.

We offer several programs here at our Apple Valley location. Our clients can come to our facility Monday through Friday from 8:30 to 2:30 where we teach them about independent life and life goals. It's a social program so we go bowling and we take them to different food places. We like this concept because - not only do we all like to eat - but we can teach them certain money and social skills out in the community.

We like to make their experience as fun as possible because they don't "have to" be here, it's their choice. Everyday there is a different curriculum - we go to museums, parks and great places to eat, of course haha. Here, we can teach them certain writing and money skills so they are prepared when they go out in the community.

We are not a behavioral program...we are a social program. Any individual with developmental disabilities, including autism, can apply for services at the Inland Regional Center where they can go through the process and then choose to come to our location here in Apple Valley.

It's a great community here. We are all looking out for each other."

Community Input Sought for Corridor Enhancement Plan


From its historic beginning as a small cluster of retail shops, to a larger business corridor that runs along Highway 18, the Apple Valley Village Business District has gone through many changes.
